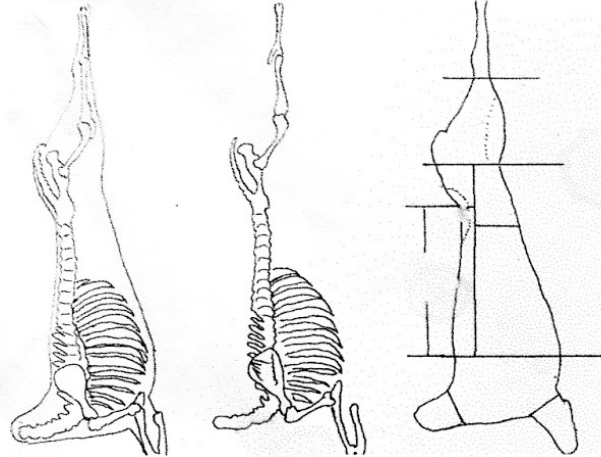
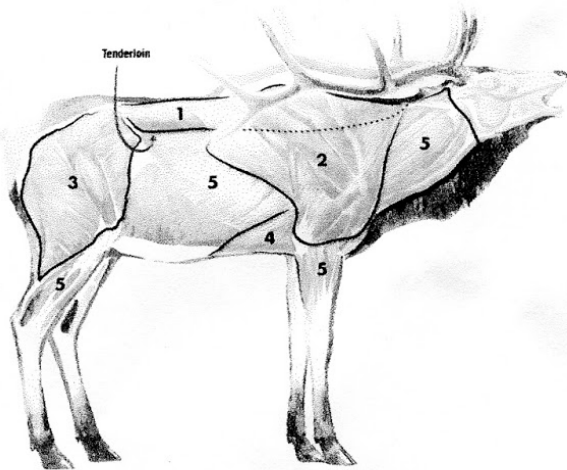

## HOW MUCH MEAT SHOULD I EXPECT TO PUT IN THE FREEZER?



- Live mature bull elk in the field @600-800 lbs. \*Carcass weight @340 lbs. \* Bones & Waste=40-50% \*Finished Product 50-55%  
-Live mature cow elk in the field @350-450 lbs. \*Carcass weight @245 lbs.

Bull Elk-@170-175 lbs.finished packaged product  
Cow Elk-@120-130 lbs.finished packaged product

\*There are **MANY** variables in the final yield of finished product from each individual animal. A few of the items that can affect the final yield are; Shot placement, Multiple shot kills, Improper field care, Physical condition, Age of the animal and geographical location in which the animal was harvested.

The items listed below are only an estimate of the average healthy animal, clean kill and well taken care of carcass in the field individual cut yield.

- 1.Loin or back strap- approx.\*8-9% of total yield- Inside tenderloin- approx.\*1% or less of total yield
- 2.Shoulder- approx.\*35% of total yield
- 3.Round- approx.\*20% of total yield
4. & 5. Ribs and trim meat- approx.\*35% of total yield

\*Yields are approximate provided the meat is not spoiled/spoiling, not bloodshot, not dirty/hairy, not hacked into small pieces and does not have scar tissue in the muscle.

Listed below are the average bone-in carcass weights from the previous years seasons. We weigh your animal upon drop off so that you will have an idea of what to expect to yield as final product. We process each animal individually, What you bring in is what you get back.

### Bone In Carcass Weights

Large Mule Deer Bucks- 125-140 lbs.  
Large Whitetail Deer Bucks-80-90 lbs.  
Medium Mule Deer Bucks-85-100 lbs.  
Medium Whitetail Deer Bucks- 65-75 lbs.  
Small Mule Deer Bucks-45-70 lbs.  
Small Whitetail Deer Bucks-35-55 lbs.

Large Bull Elk- 350-400 lbs.  
Medium Bull Elk- 275-350 lbs.  
Spike Bulls/Adult Cows- 220-295 lbs.  
Yearling Cows- 150-200 lbs.  
Calf Elk- 80-125 lbs.
